I am pleased to see so many children scooting and cycling to school. It is a great way to get the blood pumping before school and to ensure children are awake and ready to learn.


Please can I remind parents though that children need to get off their scooters and bikes when they arrive at school and walk them to the parking pods. Thank You.



RED BUMP NOTES



I am sure you are all aware of our red bump notes, some of you more than others! We have had a few concerns recently regarding how often children are coming home with these.

Red bump notes are given to any child who says they have had a knock to the head, even if it is very minor and there is no evidence at all that anything has even happened. The reason for this is that we are not prepared to take any risks when it comes to head injuries as it could be serious. If the trained office staff feel that the head injury is more serious you will receive a phone call from the office to explain what has happened.

You will find that the younger children, particularly those in Nursery and Reception will tend to come home with more red bump notes and injuries. The majority of the time this is due to them exploring their environment but with limited awareness of their surroundings. They tend to focus on themselves and get so involved in what they are doing they forget there are other children around and other obstacles they can bump into and fall over. In KS1, the additional issue is the love of an ice pack and red bump notes so children will say things have happened just to get the coveted ice pack and bump note.

Although we always want our children to be safe and not to be hurt, we do need them to explore, climb, build and learn about risk. If we never give them opportunities to take risks, they will not learn to manage risk and recognise when the risk is too high. In addition to this, in early years in particular, the children need to develop core strength as this will in turn support their ability to sit in class and focus and help them develop better fine motor skills which are needed for art and writing.

I just want to reassure all parents that receiving a red bump note does not mean that their child is being careless or overly clumsy, they are just learning. If we ever had any concerns over a child's physical development, we would of course be in touch with you to discuss this further. If at any point you have any concerns, please contact your child's class teacher.
