child, please pass this message on to them.



COVID REMINDERS

If your child has any of the following symptoms you must get a PCR test before your child can come to school.



A temperature about 37.8°C A persistent cough A loss of taste of smell

LFT are only to be used when a child does not have any symptoms.

This is the same rule for children and members of staff

If anyone in your household is awaiting the results of a PCR test you must keep all children/siblings etc. away from school until the result is confirmed and advice from NHS Test and Trace has been received.

Until recently, any student who had come into close contact with a positive COVID case was allowed to continue attending school. This was also the case for fully vaccinated adults.


The rules have now changed meaning that if someone has come into contact with the Omicron variant, they must isolate for 10 days, regardless of age or vaccination status.


When you go for a PCR test, you do not know whether you are positive, or which variant you have, and the results can take a day or two to come back.

In order to protect our community as we approach the Christmas holidays, (I am sure we all want to spend time with family, knowing we are safe) from today:

If anyone in your household is awaiting the results of a PCR test you must keep all children/siblings etc away from school until the result is confirmed and advice from NHS Test and Trace has been received.

This will stop a potential domino effect of isolations.
