Clearly I understand that there are additional factors that are impacting on attendance but please do not underestimate the importance of regular attendance in school. If your child is not in school that they will not be learning. Attendance, especially in the younger classes is key to the children making strong progress. It is also important that children are on time as this can also have a negative affect on progress.

PLEASE BE ON TIME

Please drop your child off at school between 8.45 and 8.55 so they are ready to learn at 9am.

PUNCTUALITY

It is so important that your children are in school on time. It is disruptive for them if they come in late and also disruptive to the other children in the class. In addition to this learning starts at 9am in the classroom. If they are just 10 minutes late a day that is 50 minutes a week that they are missing, over a term and a year, that is a lot of lost learning.

Due to timetabling, a lot of targeted work is also done first thing in the morning. If your child is not in on time, they are missing carefully planned support or challenge that will help them with their learning and if missed will be a real shame.

Please be on time.

From Monday 10th January the gate will be closed at 8.55am. All children should be in school by this time so they can be settled into the classroom by 9am. If the gate is closed when you arrive, please bring your child to the main entrance to be marked into school.

SOME REMINDERS

This term, our priority is to keep the school running as smoothly as possible and keep the children in school. Nobody wants a return to remote learning, least of all the staff in school.




Although the latest strain of COVID is much milder, the issue is if children and staff catch the virus, they still have to isolate for at least 7 days. If teachers are off and we have an increased number of staff isolating, it may be that we are unable, safely, to have children in school. For that reason, we want to do all we can to limit the spread of the virus.

In school, we will be continuing to encourage the children to have good hygiene. We will be ensuring all areas of the school are well ventilated. This does mean that the classrooms may be cold at times. Please remember this and send your child in with layers on to keep them warm. If they want to, children can wear navy blue fleeces in the classroom. Children's seating will be changed regularly to avoid children always being near the windows but this cannot be avoided all the time.

As we continue to follow government guidance, if your child develops any of the main 3 symptoms (a temperature above 37.8%, a persistent cough or loss of taste/smell) you will need to get a PCR test before your child can come into school. If your child does develop any other cold or flu like symptoms please would you consider doing an LFT test before sending them into school (if they are well enough). If the LFT test is positive, there is no longer any need to get a PCR, the LFT result is enough to go from. The rules for isolation are shown below. If your child test positive for COVID, please let the school know when they are well enough to start remote learning and we will set this up straight away.

KEEPING OUR CHILDREN SAFEI

Please take the time to read these reminders and share them with your children. All of the points below are made in your children's best interest and we hope you will support us with them.

ZIG ZAGS

Please do not park or drop off on the zig zags at any time of the day and for any length of time.

This includes when you are picking up from after school club.

The zig zag lines are there to ensure that the crossing is kept clear and children can be seen by cars as well as children being able to see cars coming down Watkins Rise and the car park.





SCOOTING/CYCLING ON SCHOOL GROUNDS

We encourage children to scooter/cycle to school as part of a healthy lifestyle. If your child is scooting/cycling to school, please remind them that **scooting/cycling on the site is not permitted**. On arriving at the school gate, please ensure that your child gets off their scooter/bike and places it in one of our specially designed pods
