Looking forward to September

We have been pleased at how it has worked with children coming into school in their PE kits on days they have PE. It has meant that children are spending more time in active PE rather than having to take time to change at the start and end of the lesson and we have less lost property around.

For this reason, we have decided to continue with this in September when we hope schools will be operating without any restrictions. It is important however that children wear the correct PE kits.

All children should wear a light blue polo shirt (with or without the Ladbroke logo), plain blue shorts or plain blue tracksuit bottoms and black trainers.

School sweatshirts should be worn.

Trainers should be plain black. If your child cannot do their own laces, please choose trainers with velcro until they have learnt how to do this.

If another adult is going to be collecting your child at the end of the day, please would you inform the school via the Gateway so teachers are aware. Can I also ask that children are collected on time from after school clubs.

Multiskills club members are collected from the main office door.

Netball club are collected from outside the Y3/4 classrooms

Football club members are collected from the bottom of the ramp to the field next to the new build

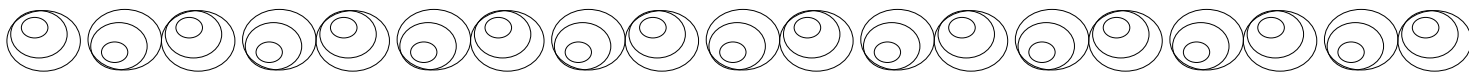
If Y6 children are walking home by themselves after the club, we must have this in writing.

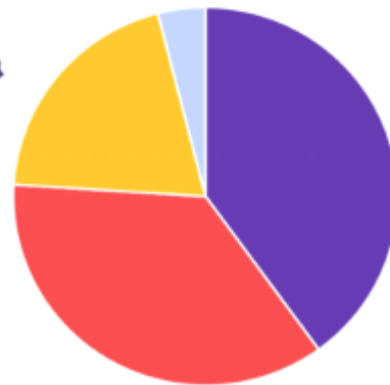
How it works...
