Clearly I understand that there are additional factors that are impacting on attendance but please do not underestimate the importance of regular attendance in school. If your child is not in school they will not be learning. Attendance, especially in the younger classes is key to the children building positive relationships and making strong progress. It is also important that children are on time as this can also have a negative affect on progress.

PUNCTUALITY

It is so important that your children are in school on time. It is disruptive for them if they come in late and also disruptive to the other children in the class. Learning starts at as soon as the children enter the classroom. If they are just 10 minutes late a day that is 50 minutes a week that they are missing, over a term and a year, that is a lot of lost learning.

Due to timetabling, a lot of targeted work is also done first thing in the morning. If your child is not in on time, they are missing carefully planned support or challenge that will help them with their learning and if missed will be a real shame.


Additional tickets are awarded in class when the children work together to complete successful lessons and for children all being in on time and wearing the correct uniform.

ZIG ZAGS
