


## Medicines



## Ladbrooke JMI School



Parents are responsible for ensuring that their child has the necessary inhalers and epipens in school. We will endeavour to inform parents if or when the inhalers need replacing. The inhalers and epipens will be sent home at the end of each term. All inhalers are kept in the classroom under the control of the classteacher. Please ensure the actual inhaler is named with your child's name.

Only prescribed drugs can be administered, but parents/carers <u>MUST</u> have spoken to Mrs Saunders or Mrs Hammett <u>prior to the start of the school day</u> to explain how the medication should be administered and completed an authorisation form. All medicines should be brought in clearly named with the <u>original prescription label attached</u>.

MRS SAUNDERS or MRS MACCORMACK MUST BE NOTIFIED OF ANY CHANGES TO THIS





We are <u>not permitted</u> to give out any medicines that are not prescribed except in exceptional circumstances e.g. pain relief for a child with a broken arm. In this instance, Mrs Saunders or Mrs MacCormack must be informed and a form filled in to authorise administration. Please note, this includes throat lozenges

## Please note:

If your child is <u>physically sick</u> or has <u>diarrhoea</u> during the night then they should <u>not</u> be sent to school until at least 48 hours after the last episode
